

### About Point Writing Response

#### What is About Point Writing Response and why is it important?

After learning to use the About Point strategy to understand the main ideas in a reading selection, students then can use About Point Writing Response (Carr, 2000) to organize their writing for a summary, an editorial, a character sketch, or other forms of writing.

#### How can I use About Point Writing Response with my students?

Ask students to write the topic (the About) in the left column. Then, ask them to write down the point the author or they are making about the topic (the Point). Next, have students write three details to support the About Point. Since this is an outline, students can use phrases to list their thoughts. Finally, ask students to write a closing that restates the About Point in different words. Students can then use the ideas in the outline as the basis for writing a summary.

An example of an About Point Writing Response outline and summary follows.

#### **Planning Outline**

**About:** Thomas Jefferson

**Point:** was an outstanding man

**Supporting Details:** 1. helped write the Declaration of Independence

2. was the third President of the United States

3. designed the University of Virginia and Monticello

Closing: Thomas Jefferson did many things well.

#### Summary

Thomas Jefferson was an outstanding man. He helped write the Declaration of Independence. Jefferson also served as the third President of the United States. He designed the University of Virginia and his home, Monticello. Thomas Jefferson did many things well.
